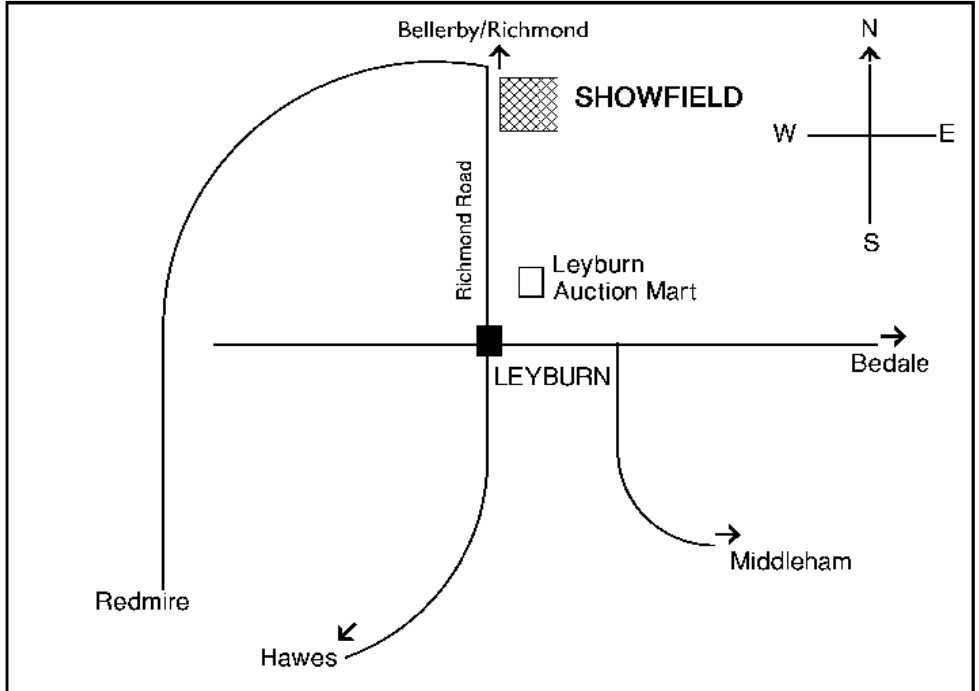

# GENERAL RULES

1. The Wensleydale Agricultural Society Ltd is managed by a board of directors elected by the members.
2. The annual show is organised by the show committee consisting of the President, Committee, Treasurer, Secretaries and Members. The President, Vice-President, Committee, Treasurer and Secretaries to be elected annually at the General Meeting.
3. The Committee shall consist of not less than 15 members who shall have the entire management of the Society, subject to the existing Rules, and five shall form a quorum. The elected Committee to have power to co-opt additional members.
4. The Chairman, Treasurer and Secretaries shall be ex-officio members of all Committees.
5. Annual Subscriptions shall become due and payable on the first day of June in each year. Subscriptions remaining unpaid on August 1st in each year shall be considered in arrear.
6. A member who is in arrears with their subscriptions shall not vote at any meeting of the Society, nor enjoy any of its privileges.
7. Members will receive three admission tickets.
8. Exhibitors will be allocated tickets in accordance with their section (as stated on entry forms), at the discretion of the Secretary. Children entering the Young Peoples Section will automatically qualify for a child's entrance ticket.
9. The Annual General Meeting shall be held each year in the Leyburn area.
10. The Committee shall compile the Annual Prize List, and are empowered to make Rules and Bye-Laws necessary for the Annual Show.
11. The Judges shall not award any prize unless exhibits are deemed worthy and no second prize shall be awarded unless there are three entries in a class, except where the Judge specially recommend a prize be awarded. The Committee reserve the right to amalgamate classes if entries are less than three.
12. All objections must be made to the Secretary, and a deposit of £10 paid, within seven days of the close of the Show, when the Committee will decide, and should the objection be ruled by the Committee to be frivolous the £10 shall be forfeited to the funds of the Show.
13. Should any prize have been forfeited through a protest against the exhibit to which it was awarded, such prize will, in all cases, be paid to the next in merit duly qualified, if distinguished by the Judges.
14. The exhibits will only be admitted between the hours of 8 a.m. and 9.45 a.m. except Handicrafts and Homecrafts (See Special Rules Handicraft and Homecraft Section) after which no exhibit will be allowed to enter under any pretext whatever, and no exhibit will be allowed to leave the ground before 4.30 p.m. except by permission of the Secretary.
15. All matters upon which a question of dispute or doubt shall arise not provided for in the Rules of the Society or in the conditions attached to any prize, shall be referred to the Committee, whose decision shall be final and binding on all parties interested.
16. The Society will not be held responsible for any accident that may occur through or to any exhibit at the Show.
17. No entrance tickets will be sent to members who have not paid their subscriptions.
18. Local classes are confined to entrants residing within a ten mile radius of Leyburn Market Place or within the remaining catchment area of the River Ure to the west. However all classes are open unless otherwise stated.
19. It is the responsibility of the trophy recipients to have the item engraved if they so wish.

# LIVESTOCK SECTIONS

## Special Rules and General Show Yard Regulations

1. No livestock entered in classes where prizes are offered can be admitted to the Show unless a written Entry form accompanied with the required fee has been received by the Secretary on or before the Entries closing date.
2. Every exhibitor of stock will be allowed free tickets to the Show Field for Attendants on Animals, or Pens of Animals, according to entry, at the discretion of the Secretary.
3. All stock must be bona-fide property of the exhibitor on the day of the Show.
4. Any exhibitor bringing any animal in the Show Yard affected with any contagious disorder, shall, on proof thereof forfeit ten pounds to the Secretary for the use of the Society, and any exhibitor removing stock before the close of the Show without the consent of the Secretary, or giving false or incorrect information, shall forfeit every unpaid prize and all entrance money, and be debarred from the Society's Show for three years.
5. If you wish to enter Sheep from a scrapie monitored flock, please contact the Secretary.
6. The Society will make the best arrangements in their power for the accommodation and safety of the public but will not be responsible for loss arising from accident or otherwise. Exhibitors are reminded that it is their responsibility to insure against damage caused by their animals.
7. Exhibitors must have full public liability insurance as they are wholly responsible for any damage or injury caused by their livestock or machinery. The show does not accept any responsibility or liability for any such damage or injury. Furthermore the show expects all animal handlers under the age of 16 to be accompanied at all times by a responsible adult when moving or showing animals at the show.

## GENERAL NOTES

- (a) Cows or Heifers calving at the Show or which have any signs of discharge must be reported to the Veterinary Officer and will be placed in isolation and returned to the herd of origin as soon as practicable. If calving takes place or abdominal discharge occurs before the time of judging such animals will not be allowed to compete.
- (b) Where private tests for Brucellosis have been carried out on any animal in Scheme Herds, copies of the test certificate or laboratory report must be sent to the Divisional Veterinary Officer.
- (c) No animal will be admitted to the Show unless accompanied by the correct papers.
- (d) Herd Book No. and Name of animal must be submitted for pedigree animals on entry form.
- (e) Substitutes will be allowed, subject to details of the substituted animals being provided. (f) Animals which calve or show evidence of calving whilst at the showground must be placed in the approved isolation accommodation pending their possible early removal from the showground.
- (g) Where an animal calves at full term, and the owner arranges for a blood sample and a vaginal swab to be taken and examined at an approved laboratory, and the Rose Bengal Plate Test (RBPT) and microscopical examination of a smear made from the vaginal swab are negative, the animal may return to the show lines at the discretion of the show secretary.
- (h) Where an animal calves prematurely or aborts, the DVO must be informed immediately. The animal must be returned home. **TOGETHER WITH ALL OTHER SHOW ANIMALS FROM THE SAME REGISTERED PREMISES** after a full range of samples (including, if at all possible, a placental smear) has been taken. The suspect animals must be isolated during transit.

# SPECIAL BIO-SECURITY REGULATIONS

## Applicable to Sheep and Cattle Classes.

1. Clean clothing, or clothing which is capable of being cleansed and disinfected, must be worn.
2. All livestock must be returned to the originating holding at the end of the Show.
3. All exhibitors must arrange the licenses appropriate to the rules in force at the time of the Show.
4. The public must not touch the animals.
5. No person will leave the animal area without cleansing and disinfecting their footwear.
6. Livestock vehicles that are not being fully cleansed and disinfected on the premises must remain within the animal area.
7. No vehicle or person will enter or leave the animal area visibly contaminated with animal faeces.

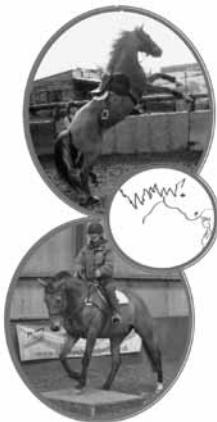

The hats will be worn when the troops are off duty so they do not have to be in specific colours and at the moment we are knitting them mainly in rib so they can stretch to fit any size head but any type of knitted hat would be appreciated.  
The hats can be knitted in any wool and virtually any colour but please use discretion in the choice of colours e.g. no white or fluorescents for safety reasons.

### **Basic Ribbed Woollen hat – DK or Chunky**

Double knit and size 8 (4mm) needles or Chunky and size 4 (6mm) needles  
Cast on 120 stitches for DK or 84 stitches for chunky and rib (2 plain 2 purl) for 10 inches (25.5cm)  
Next row knit 2 together to the end of the row  
Purl next row  
Next row knit 2 together to the end of the row  
Purl next row  
Knit 1 row  
Purl 1 row  
Break off yarn, run yarn through remaining sts, draw up and fasten off. Join back seam.

Mix flour and seasonings, rub in butter, stir in olives, tomatoes and cheese (reserve a little for tops).

Mix to a soft dough with the milk, reserving a little for glazing.

Roll out, cut into rounds, place on greased baking tray, brush with milk and sprinkle with cheese.

Bake for 12 – 15 minutes or until golden brown.

200g (8oz) butter  
100g (4oz) dark chocolate (70% cocoa solids)  
150g pot natural yoghurt  
1 tsp vanilla extract  
3 large eggs  
250g (9oz) SR flour  
175g (6oz) dark muscovado sugar  
½ tsp bicarbonate of soda

Topping

100ml (3 ½ fl oz) double cream  
1tbsp butter  
100g (4oz) dark chocolate chopped

Oven 190°C, 170°C fan, Gas 5

Line 1 very large or 2 x 1lb loaf tins

Put the butter and chocolate in a large pan, heat gently until melted, stir and cool for 5 minutes then use a whisk to stir in yoghurt, vanilla, eggs and a pinch of salt.

Mix the flour, sugar and bicarbonate of soda and stir into the chocolate mix. Ensure mix is smooth- no lumps of sugar. Pour or spoon into prepared tin(s), then bake for 45 minutes or until cooked. Leave in the tin for 15 minutes, then remove and allow to cool.

Put the cream into a small pan, bring to the boil then add the butter and half the chocolate chopped. Take off the heat and leave to melt. Stir until smooth and shiny.

Spoon over the cake don't worry if it runs down the sides. Then scatter with second half of the chocolate on top. Allow to set and cool.

Ingredients: Makes 18 fingers

200g (8oz) butter well softened

200g (8oz) golden caster sugar

4 large eggs

100g (4oz) fine polenta or fine cornmeal (available in supermarkets)

140g (5oz) SR flour

Zest of 3 lemons – finely grated

4tbsp lemon curd

Drizzle

5tbsp golden or white caster sugar

Zest and juice of 1 lemon

Method:

Heat oven to 180°C, 160°C fan, Gas 4 and make sure there is a shelf ready in the middle of the oven. Grease a rectangular baking tray or small roasting tin, about 20cm x 30 cm. Cut out a sheet of baking paper a bit larger than the tin then push it in and smooth it out with your hands so it sticks to the base and the sides. Snip into the corners with scissors to get the paper to lie neatly.

Put all the cake ingredients and a pinch of salt except the lemon curd into a large bowl, then use electric beaters to beat until creamy and smooth. Scoop into the tin, then level the top.

Spoon the lemon curd over the batter in thick stripes. Use the handle of the spoon to swirl the curd into the cake – not too much or you won't see the swirls once it's cooked. Bake for about 35 minutes or until golden and risen. It should have shrunk away from the sides of the tin slightly and feel springy. Don't open the oven before 30 minutes cooking is up.

Leave the cake in the tin for 10 minutes or until just cool enough to handle. Carefully lift out of the tin and put onto a cooling rack, sat over a tray to catch the drips of drizzle.

To make the drizzle mix 4 tbsp sugar and the lemon juice together and spoon over the cake. Toss the lemon zest with the final 1 tbsp sugar and scatter over the top.

Let the cake cool completely then lift onto a board, peel away the sides of the baking paper and cut the cake into fingers or squares.

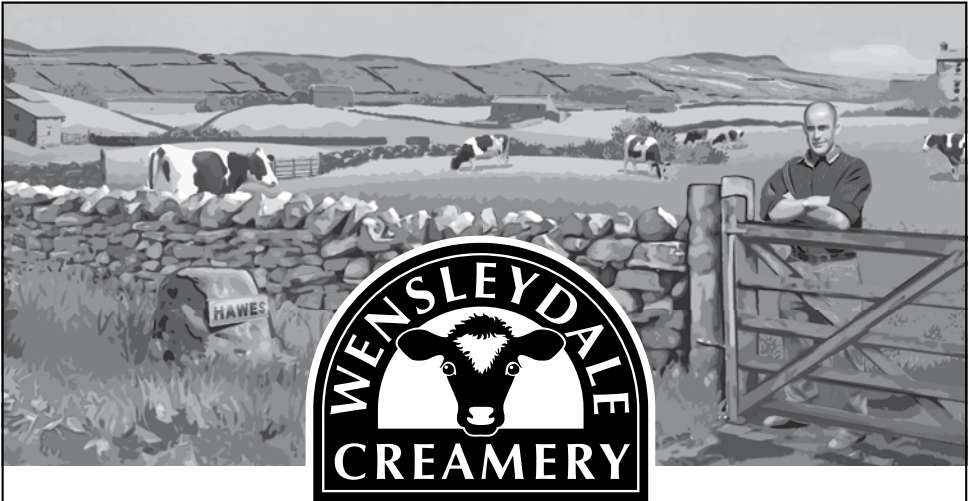
